



Director's Note:

Storytelling, theatre or otherwise, was a huge part of my childhood. It was how I learned English when I moved to the States, and ultimately how I started to write. "Yours and Mine" started out as a way to pass time on the tube, but by the time I got home I had a mash up of my experiences, feelings and questions, outlining the beginnings of a script. I wanted to challenge gender roles and the idea of what's right and wrong in relationships. I hoped to show that people making traditionally wrong decisions are human at the end of the day.

I started with a script, then a screenplay, and then back again to a script. I hadn't actually thought it possible to try to stage it until I joined New Theatre, and I want to thank them both for the opportunity and tremendous support I've gotten in turning a thought into a show.

To say that I want to thank Tom is a massive understatement. He came in during the early days of the production, when I was still completely lost in NT. I have since continued to get lost, but he always finds me. His patience and guidance has gone beyond producing, and I can legitimately say that none of this would have been possible without him. I also want to thank my actors, Karl, Niamh, Beth, Will, Joe and Gary, who took on a pretty big script littered with a mix of British and American English and helped decipher it. You brought out aspects and possibilities within the characters I hadn't considered, and helped me make the script perform—able.
